They discovered how the Plains Cree lived many years and the importance of working together in a community, they relived the Battle of Batoche and Metis life back in the 1800's, and they experienced new animals from skinks to garter snakes. On top of that, they also learned that they can overcome anxiety caused by being away from home or seeing a strange new insect called a tick. ## <u>Welcome Janvier</u>

On Monday June 13, Conklin Community School staff and students will welcome up to 25 students from Janvier. They are attending our school because their school was closed due to smoke damage.

Why are they coming to Conklin if their school is closed? All children are entitled to an education. It is one of those basic human rights we enjoy in Canada. The Minister of Education has instructed all schools across Alberta to accommodate students displaced by school closures caused by the wildfires.

To prepare for the influx of new students into our school, Ms. Hammond and Ms. Best, two teachers from Janvier, have volunteered to co-teach with our teachers. In addition, there will be another person from Janvier to help supervise.

During the assembly on Tuesday, I reminded the students about empathy. I asked them to feel what it would be like to be displaced and not go to school. I also asked them to think of ways to welcome the new students to our school. Simple things like playing tag at recess or sharing a snack. Please talk to your children about empathy.

Of course any parent would worry about teasing and bullying especially when there are new students arriving. In previous newsletters, I have mentioned that we have a bullying problem at our school. There was some improvement but we must remain aware. We have introduced a strategy called **WITS** to the students. It stands for **W**alk away, **I**gnore, **T**alk it out and **S**eek help. It's a strategy the students can use if they are being teased or bullied. Also we will have increased supervision during breaks and two staff members per class.

Let's make the last few weeks fun and memorable for all.

As always, stop by the school and see the learning taking place.
